Pastor's Message

And now, you will conceive in your womb and bear a son, and you will name him Jesus. Luke 1:31, New Revised Standard Version

December can be heavy going for some of us, and sometimes, maybe all of us. Whether we accept Christmas as a religious festival or work to contrive an opportunity to eat, drink, and be merry with a bleak mid-winter party, Christmas always has a lists and expectations stage. This year, we are far less concerned with the COVID-19 that complicated our plans in the last few years, though it lingers in the back of our minds as a vague threat. December can leave many feeling worn out with giving and planning. . . or loneliness - rather than filled with the much hyped tidings of comfort and joy. I reckon we've all been trained to present ourselves as jolly at this time of year, no matter what is really going on inside us. An empty laugh, nevertheless, can long echo hollow in the soul. It is a sad realization to have been left out in the cold because there is "no room at the inn," or near the fire, or around a family dinner table.

Our world around us tends to party before Christmas and then pack up the festival as soon as "the big day" is over. For the faithful, this can be an alien time of the year, because in contrast, the Christian tradition struggles to see the weeks of December as a time of waiting and expectancy, a period of scarcity and preparation, with the partying starting only on the first of the Twelve Days of Christmas.

Still, the quiet and the pregnant emptiness is not always a bad place to be. The discipline of hoping, of expectancy, can have its abundant blessings. Only in the dark night have we any chance to see our star. This is a deceptively simple lesson – try looking for stars in the sunlight. The roundness of an expectant mother enroute to Bethlehem is a simple sign of the divine lurking hidden in our midst. Whatever kind of December you

are experiencing, God is with us. Live this month, this week, this day... this moment. Bill Keane was a Philadelphia boy, who worked for the old Philadelphia Bulletin, and was the cartoonist who drew Family Circus. He said, "Yesterday is history; tomorrow is a mystery; today is a gift of God, which is why we call it the present."



To Bethlehem and To Kingdom Come

Almighty God, give us grace, that we may cast away the works of darkness, and put upon us the armor of light, now in this mortal life, in which thy Son Jesus Christ came to visit us in great humility; that in the last day, when he shall come again in his glorious majesty to judge both the quick and the dead, we may rise to the life immortal, through him who liveth and reigneth with thee and the Holy Ghost, now and ever. Amen.

The First English Prayer Book, 1549

Though Christmas can be a troubling time to some, mostly, to use a familiar seasonal phrase, it reminds us of "comfort and joy." Using many familiar characters and episodes, Christmas tells the story of Jesus' birth. All the well-known Christmas scenes point us in the same beautiful direction. We may surprise ourselves with how much of the scripture account we can recall word for word. It is not at all by chance that we all seem to have vivid memories of Christmas; singing the carols, worshiping in the candlelight, and hearing that mystical passage, the prologue to the Gospel of John.

Advent is much more of a challenge and (perhaps I can begin an argument) is more important for us disciples. Firstly, Advent covers a wider scope. Advent celebrates Christ coming again at the close of the age, and it celebrates those events when the Christ continually comes; post-resurrection experiences, where two or three are gathered, and in the Lord's Supper. Advent illuminates for us that the time between incarnation and final coming is one of continual imminence. Christ is coming now; not only in the past or in the future!

This set of ideas can be illustrated for us by considering the squabble generations of scripture translators have over the Aramaic word maranatha (the word shows up in 1 Corinthians 16:22). To see the word's double meaning depends on the division of the syllables: marana tha means "come, our Lord," and maran atha means "our Lord has come." Examining the original texts does not conclusively show which way to split the word – much to the frustration of the literalists, the entertainment of the playful, and the benefit of the faith. The term was significant in early Christian spirituality and has meaning for many Christians today.

In O Come Emmanuel: Scripture Verses for Advent Worship, William Marshall states, "It is only because Christ is present with us now that we long and pray for his fuller manifestation." Here Marshall has made a maranatha statement. Both are crucial to understanding the expectation and celebration of the Advent-Christmas-Epiphany Seasons.

Again this year, the people of Drexel Hill United Methodist Church will celebrate the season with parties, presents, and meals. We will join with friends, believers and otherwise, in warmth and hospitality. We will also behold Maranatha: Come, our Lord. Our Lord has come.
