Let's Get Mystical Pastor's Message

Honor your father and your mother, so that your days may be long in the land that the Lord your God is giving you. Exodus 20:12, NRSV

Some put the Ten Commandments at the very center of biblical ethics. To be sure, these rules are just about indispensable in order to have a community . . . though there are individuals and interests of late that seem hell-bent on removing any hope of trust from our civil lives. And yet, even those who violate the rules - 'Don't murder'; 'Don't steal'; 'Don't commit adultery': - would heartily agree that they didn't want someone to violate them in such a way. Few would disagree that these principles remain the foundation of all morality.

Are they still commandments though? Are they, perhaps, simply sound ethical principles, part of what Thomas Hobbes described as the social contract, essential if any of us wants to survive in a reality which would otherwise be 'nasty, brutish, and short'?



Where does morality come from? The question turns on whether we believe such notions are some sort of agreed-upon framework, strictly observed by some, loosely by others, and travelling along a spectrum of inquiry that leads to the idea that there is a One out there who commands.

God speaks through sacred texts. Some acknowledge this, but for others it is the collective voice of humanity here on earth that adjudicates how we should behave. I find the 'God speaks' framing much more convincing, but recognize that we must work within the 'collective voice of humanity' frame in order to get anything accomplished these days.

I'm finding the language of the mystics most helpful at the moment, who speak of God beyond all worlds, yet filling all worlds, and whose presence is within all life.

Seen this way, God's commandments speak from the tenderness and vulnerability of children, the needs of the sick, the outrage of those suffering injustice, the beauty of birdsong, and the cries of the first lambs. 'Honor life; care for life; never hurt life', they all say, and this is the root of everything that matters. Thank You, Gracious Lord, for your great power and love for all people.

Even during times of trial, help us to see that we are all one world community; that our actions affect those around us. Teach us to hear your voice in all life and make us understand that the health and safety of our families' rests in everyone working together with love and compassion for each other. May you be our guide, O Lord, and may we always praise and glorify you. Amen.
