Pastor's Message

Go therefore and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit, and teaching them to obey everything that I have commanded you. And remember, I am with you always, to the end of the age. Matthew 28:19-20

As we enter the season of Pentecost, which covers half the calendar year, we are called by God to consider ways we can be more faithful to the Great Commission Jesus gives his disciples at the end of Matthew's Gospel account. Jesus' Great Commission says, in essence – "Go! Don't hang around here waiting for things to happen and for people to come to *you!* Go! If you want there to be disciples, then go and make them!"

In our professional culture of extreme specialization, it might be humbling to recall that Jesus was a layperson. There was an old established religious tradition when Jesus came on the scene. It had religious specialist priests, scholars, and functionaries. But rather than quietly fill a slot in its bureaucracy, Jesus built a powerful lay movement. Jesus did not garner and guard power for himself. He empowered others instead, ministering in close quarters with his friends with the expectation that they, too, would empower others into ministry.

In more contemporary terms, we could say that Jesus freed his followers so that they, too, could confidently go out and perform miracles in daily life.

We can do the same. In fact, as we recognize the Great Commission as instructions for us, its claim takes on more urgency. But we need to free our time and energy if we really want to feel that Pentecostal fire in our souls. So, we ought to ask ourselves some questions, questions like:

Where are the points at which we could make the ministry of the laity come to life?

What does our budget say about our values? What does the way we use the time of our volunteers—our time—say about our priorities?

What are the needs of our community that this congregation can meet?

How can we connect our faith lives with our work Monday through Friday?

I have been appointed to Drexel Hill United Methodist Church for more than six years now. I have been most impressed and thankful to see the energy and creativity of this congregation in discipleship.

These are only a handful of the dozens of questions I have heard discussed and that we should consider as we redefine the Great Commission for our congregation and our day moving freely inside and outside that rather curious and not Jesus-like institution of membership.

Because the Church is the Body of Christ - the hands, feet, and voice of Jesus until the end of time - it is not here to simply exist, but it has a purpose which is most high and noble. It is the same purpose as Jesus had for his disciples so long ago: "to transform and restore the world to its original harmony with God," as David Crabtree, a contemporary church historian phrases it. That purpose has many implications, but the most important is this: We are "sent forth," to be here in the building only long enough to determine what it is that we need to do to minister this week in the name of Christ—at our jobs, at the grocery store, or at the theatre. Wherever we are, we are first and foremost free to be the Body of Christ, the voice of Christ, the hands, and the feet of Christ.

That's what being the church is all about. And if at times it feels more like a burden than a liberation, then we are the ones called to make it work the way Jesus had in mind.

So, the final question for today is this: Is that our goal—to make the church more like what Jesus had in mind?

Join us on **Tuesdays** at 11am to 11:50am where we will




gather in the Gym to hear a psalm and reflect on it briefly, and then engage in light exercise – walking the neighborhood if the weather is fine, or
