Pastor's Message

Psalm 139:16

I was pleased and relieved when I did the math and discovered I was only 28. In media advertising we are bombarded with images telling us how 'Product X' will help us deny the aging process and astound our friends at how young we look; incidentally, if you do a little analysis . . . the actors in such commercials are in their 20s and the target audience is the 60+ crowd. Either that or there is heavy investment in the somewhat small potential of selling denture fixative and funeral plans to a demographic that never prepared for Y2K.

Does it bother me that I am getting old? Well, yes! I don't like the extra effort it takes to shed weight and I don't like the loss of balance. I won't start talking about my teeth. 

March 17, 2023





Lent has seen the reintroduction of the Psalter to our worship. The practice of reading a psalm aloud together in worship has been, and still is, a practice of rote learning and the punctuation of the text with a sung response goes back to the recording of the Psalms themselves. Our Sunday morning scripture gathering, "Together in the Word" (9:45-9:30pm) will consider the psalm for the day before the service begins.



The leading concerns of the texts for the First Sunday in Lent were temptation, sin, and the effects of sin. The lections selected emphasized the account of the initial sin by the first two human beings, their disobedience of the divine command, but these verses are best seen in their context.

As we move deeper into Lent, water is the dominant motif of the texts. The Third Sunday in Lent, March 3rd, leads in various ways to reflection upon human need and divine grace. The Exodus 17:1-7 lesson is one of the many accounts of the people of Israel complaining in the wilderness, in this case because of thirst. The Lord's response is to tell Moses how to bring water from the rock. The psalm, a liturgy of praise, responds directly to Exodus 17, celebrating God's care for God's people and admonishing them with the example of the complainers in the wilderness. The Gospel lesson is the account of Jesus at the well in Samaria, offering living water to the Samaritan woman.

March 12th is the first full day of the new Daylight Savings clock. Spring forward!

In their contrasts between life and death, the texts for March 26th anticipate Easter. However, all of them focus much more upon the life of the people of God this side of the grave than upon the resurrection as such. Ezekiel's vision of the valley of dry bones is a prophecy that the people of Israel, dead in exile, will live again on their land. Our morning psalter, Psalm 131 is an individual complaint song, a prayer that the Lord, who redeems Israel and is motivated by his "steadfast love" will save the person in trouble. John 11 is the account of Jesus' raising of Lazarus from the dead.

Obviously, we are being drawn toward Easter, but as April begins we still have Palm Sunday and Holly Week before Easter arrives April 9th.


Crafters & Fellowship Meetup
